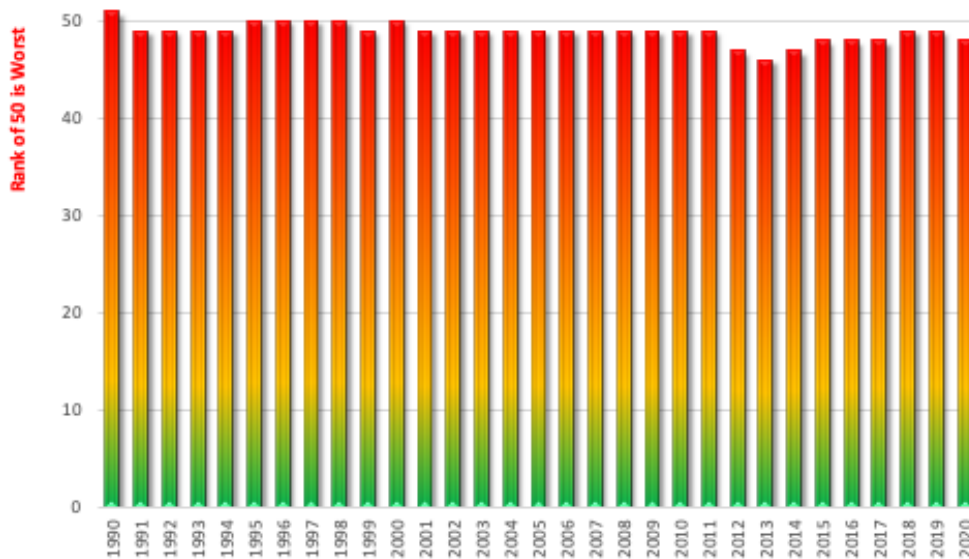

**Regarding Annual *KIDS COUNT* Reports from 1990 through 2020**

In 1990, The Annie E. Casey Foundation produced the first *KIDS COUNT Data Book* which ranked the U.S. states for child well-being. Each year since, child welfare researchers across the nation have gathered data, and evaluated numerous measures of child well-being in each state. The findings from the states are evaluated and the states are ranked in an annual *KIDS COUNT Data Book*. In 1990, Louisiana ranked 51<sup>st</sup> in the nation for child well-being. Overwhelmed by a crack cocaine epidemic, Washington DC was ranked 50<sup>th</sup> – ahead of Louisiana. Beginning at 51<sup>st</sup> meant the only way forward was to improve. Sadly, Louisiana has not improved by much. Louisiana has held tenaciously to a 31-year average rank of 49<sup>th</sup> in the nation for child well-being. Generally, during the last three decades, Louisiana’s children would have fared better in every other state but one.

## Typical Louisiana *KIDS COUNT*-related Headlines from 1990 to 2020

Each year, Louisiana's newspapers have prominently reported news about Louisiana's *KIDS COUNT* rank among the states. Often, these news reports were front-page headlines, and this is as it should be. News reports about the disadvantaged conditions of Louisiana's children deserve the attention of every citizen. Louisiana responds promptly and energetically to the crises our state endures, except for this one – the **steady-state crisis of poor child well-being**.

From the hundreds of annual headlines printed in Louisiana's newspapers during the last three decades about our state's chronic crisis of child well-being, the following collection is a sample of headlines from each of the previous 30 years. Each year, the headlines vary, but the stories tell the same truth: **Louisiana has not yet prioritized her children**.
